# TSO Convention

Patti Groce and I traveled to Lubbock on June 15, 2022 for the 93<sup>rd</sup> State Convention of TSO. We were last there in 2014 and stayed at the same hotel across from the convention center—last time it was a Holiday Inn and now it is the MCM Elegante (fancy name for an old hotel).

I attended the session, "I Am the Secretary, Now What?" as well as being involved in the 2 trainings for chapter treasurers and attending the leadership seminar event. Patti stayed busy with her TSO Committee, Personal and Professional Enrichment, as well as attending various sessions and maybe even some shopping in the vendor area.

The Opening Session featured Pipes & Drums from the Lubbock Fire Department and well as the presentation of the flags. The keynote speaker was Bear Mills, named Texas Teacher of the Year among other accolades. Patti and I got to stand up for Eta Tau's many awards including ASTEF Scholarship Honors, Five-Star Newsletter, ASTEF Leadership Journeyers, Tudor Rose Award (we increased our membership), Chapter Yearbook Early Bird and Exemplary Awards, and DKG Compliant Website. Wow—what great things we're doing in Eta Tau!

The Unifying Project this year was Shelby's Bridge, a nonprofit organization in Sudan, Texas where adults with disABILITIES (called "Friends") are trained in their gift and thrift shops as well as the café to provide opportunities toward independence to live, work, and play. Eta Tau gave two \$25 gift cards to Walmart and all the donations totaled \$5,685. Shelby and her mother had a breakout session and Shelby was also honored with the ASTEF Advocate of Education Award. A couple of DKG chapters are involved with the work in Sudan.

Friday's ASTEF ticketed event featured Steve Gomez, Lubbock Christian University Women's Head Basketball Coach. His team has received multiple titles in the NCAA Division II and he was a great speaker. . . I even won one of the door prizes!

Saturday's Service of Remembrance celebrated the life of Margaret Eisenbeck among other members that have passed away since our last convention in Denton. As usual, it was a somber event with outstanding music.

The Business Meeting was then held and I voted (just to be sure a quorum was present) and sat with presidents from Area 7. All motions went smoothly except one amendment changing the Personnel Committee from a chair plus 5 members to a committee of seven members. Someone felt like the amendment should read a chair plus 6 members and we can't tell you how long it took to count the votes for that ordeal. . . but the amendment passed.

Our International Representative was Dr. Helen Popovich, International Parliamentarian. She's about 84 years old and a delightful speaker. She told us that the International Headquarters building sold for 18 million and that money is being managed by great financial people and can only be used to lease or build but not buy a building.

Mark your calendars to join us in McAllen June 14-17, 2023 for a fabulous convention where Embassy Suites is attached to the convention center. We plan on driving the 345 miles so we have room for a couple more!
