Libraries of Love



This donation allowed us to purchase 45 African themed hard backed picture books from the *Libraries of Love* wish list on Amazon. The books were delivered to Trudy Marshall, Executive Director of Libraries of Love, in July. Each book will receive a spine label and a library pocket and will be processed for shipping this fall for delivery in Africa next summer. There are now 57 libraries established by *Libraries of Love* in Uganda and Kenya!
