

Notes from the meeting

The meeting was held virtually on WebEx due to the Covid-19 virus. There were 10 members present. Debbie Koehler's inspiration was "The Real Measure" about success. Marion Horowitz introduced the speaker, Erica Blue. She is the CEO of The Sunshine Camp. The camp was founded in 1928 by the Young Men's Business League and has been in operation at Zilker Park since then. There is also a camp at Lake Travis. They serve low income children ages 8 to 15 and aid them to build self-esteem. About 1,000 children attend each year. The camp is free and is supported by fund raisers. Each session is a 5 day overnight experience. There are 3 objectives for the program, Community, Compassion and Creativity. Zilker Lodge is available for rent when the camp is not in session. Currently the staff wants to create a quiet space for the children. The room would be used as a peace making circle room. They are in need of comfy chairs, mood lighting, tablets and SEL books. Discussion was held concerning how Eta Tau can help with the project.

Susan Harmon has officially transferred to Eta Tau Chapter. She was welcomed to the group. Members have checked on the four individuals who are unable to attend because of health issues or family situations. Sixteen names for potential members were submitted. Emily Farnsworth presented 3 names, Donna Slathar 2, Debbie Koehler 3 and Laura Packard 8. Suggestions were made concerning the best way to approach these women and encourage them to join Eta Tau. Laura Packard reminded the group to read The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek and be prepared to discuss it at the February meeting. Carole Lowe, Area 7 Coordinator, will attend. Bill Knolle returned the archives to Donna Slathar. They had been stored with Janie Knolle. Members are encouraged to attend the TSO Convention in Denton, June 17-19, 2021. The International Conference will be in San Antonio, July 21-24, 2021. One will also be help in Portland, Oregon. The Conference in Finland has been canceled due to the Pandemic.
