Recently, I read an article in <u>The Communique</u>, the TSO newsletter of Communications and Publicity, contributed by **Jerrie Dooley**, Area 6 Representative. As I read it I thought about our own newsletter. Jerrie listed five points of what a chapter newsletter accomplishes.

- 1. A good newsletter helps keep members connected. Receiving an Eta Tau newsletter emailed to your inbox is a happy occurrence for active and reserve members.
- 2. The newsletter keeps members informed of member news, upcoming meeting specifics and past meeting review, news of projects and events, and communication from the president and committee chairs.
- 3. Each chapter newsletter has a unique style with no specific rules to limit its publication. Of course, the Communications and Publicity Committee offer suggestions and guidelines for a great newsletter. But there are no restrictions for publication software used. There is no cookie cutter template that makes all chapter newsletters look alike.
- 4. Our newsletters are sent to the TSO president, the state editor, our area coordinator, and communications representative. Reviewing all chapter newsletters give these individuals a picture of each chapter and its members across the state.
- 5. The newsletter preserves the history of each chapter often giving a clearer picture of our activities better than the minutes. Jerri suggests saving the newsletters for future reference and history.

Thank you to **Donna Slathar,** our newsletter editor, who makes sure our Eta Tau newsletter achieves the five points of a good newsletter. Her extra touches of color, photos, careful editing, and adherence to state guidelines make our chapter newsletter a great five star newsletter.
