


## October Meeting

### Notes from the meeting

The meeting was held virtually on WebEx due to the Covid-19 virus. There were 9 members present. The inspiration was given by Marion Horowitz. She shared poems about celebrating Halloween during a pandemic. Emily Farnsworth and Marion Horowitz introduced Greg Rohde, AISD German teacher, who presented a program about loom weaving. He shared examples of projects he had woven. Then he demonstrated how to weave on his loom. After the demonstration, members were encouraged to make a rope on a circle loom using cotton thread.

Laura Packard ask members to choose a country where Delta Kappa Gamma has chapters. Members were to make a five minute presentation at the November meeting about the country each selected. Emily and Marion reported that CASA has asked our members to donate \$30 gift cards from Target or Walmart to be used as Christmas gifts for their teenage clients. The chapter has committed to donating 10. Gift cards or checks (made out to Marion) should be mailed to Marion by November 16. A \$25 Amazon gift card will be purchased for Greg Rohde as thanks for his program. Judy Medick and Carole Lowe will have a Zoom presentation on November 5, 2020, 7:00 p.m. to discuss how to increase membership. Members are encouraged to sign up to join the program.

Debbie Koehler reported that she had tried to contact members who have not been attending the meetings. She was able to visit with a few. She left messages with those who were not available. Donna Slathar would like for members to send pictures of the completed ropes that were woven during the meeting. Marion Horowitz reported that someone from The Sunshine Camp will speak at the January meeting.
