To commemorate the 90th year of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, the Coordinating Council of Austin and the Williamson County Chapters cohosted a birthday luncheon on May 4, 2019, at the Joe C. Thompson Conference Center on the campus of the University of Texas. The speaker for our Founder's Day Luncheon was Jody Conradt, currently serving as Special Assistant for Women's Athletics at the University of Texas. Coach Conradt coached women's basketball for 38 years, 31 of those years at the University of Texas. Her 1986 team at UT won the National Championship with a 34-0 record. As a coach, Jody Conradt's teams accumulated 900 wins, and she has been inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. In her message to us, Coach Conradt emphasized the need for commitment, passion, and focus in order to be successful. Communication skills are of upmost

importance, and being a team player versus an individual player can make the difference between success and failure. It is my personal belief, as a Delta Kappa Gamma sister, that determinedly working together will make our society stronger and more influential in the future.
